

## Book Club Discussion questions for FOOL'S BLUFF by Lee Gregg

Which character in the book would you most like to meet?

Which characters did you engage with the most? The least? And why?

How did the characters change or grow throughout the story? How did your opinion of them change?

Which character did you relate to the most, and what was it about them that you connected with?

Did the characters seem believable to you? Did they remind you of anyone?

What motivates different character's actions? Do you think those actions are justified or ethical?

If you could hear this same story from another character's point of view, who would you choose?

What was your initial reaction to the book? Did it hook you immediately, or take some time to get into?

Do you think the story was plot-based or character driven?

Did the book's pace seem too fast/too slow/just right?

How well do you think Lee Gregg built the world/setting in the book?

What did you think of the book's length? If you thought it too long, what would you cut? If too short, what would you add?

Did the book evoke any feelings for you? Were there any passages you found particularly funny, emotional, interesting or revealing?

Share a favorite quote from the book. Why did this quote stand out?

If you got the chance to ask Lee Gregg one question, what would it be?

What do you think of the book's cover? How well does it convey what the book is about?

What do you think of the book's title? How does it relate to the book's contents? What other title might you choose?

Would you read another book by Lee Gregg? Why or why not?

As *Fool's Bluff* is a whodunit, what did you figure out and when? And were your guesses right? Was there a point in the book where you began to piece together what happened or did Lee keep you guessing until the end of the story?

How effective is the use of plot twists and red herrings in *Fool's Bluff*?

Did you pick out any themes throughout the book? How are these themes expressed or explored? How well were the themes developed? Give examples.

How did you feel about the ending?
